



# Luton and WW2, 1940-1945

- Arrived April 1940, rented 105, Ashburnham Road near to the St Marie Convent School in Rothesay Road
- Christine's father had a job in the offices at Commer Cars
- He was also an Air Raid Warden with a bike.
- Christine played tennis (well) with Ruth in Wardown Park
- After leaving the convent, Christine when to Art school at Park Square, Luton.
- Towards the end of the war she reluctantly took a job as a hairdresser but had to give it up after 10 months because of dermatitis on her hands.

- Fred, now 55 was employed in the office.



- In July 1944, this photo was stamped by the police at Mildenhall in Suffolk.
- The assumption is that Pat was working at RAF Mildenhall, the headquarters of No. 3 Group Bomber Command.
- Probably also at RAF Lakenheath
- Living in Brook St., Luton Feb 1946






# Art in South Kensington 1945-1950

- Christine went to lodge with a Mrs Jessie Hood, and Miss Kate Aylett at 144 Bedford Road, Clapham, London SW4
- She enjoyed working in an art studio in South Kensington making props for the theatre, including a plaster-casting, lot of work with paper mâché, and a head(!) for Michael Redgrave as Macbeth at the Aldwych Theatre in 1947, amongst many other items.
- Christine met her future husband, Patrick Hanna at ballroom dancing classes in Rothesay Road, Luton in 1945 while he was on a contract with George Wimpey at Vauxhall.
- On April 27th 1947, Pat left for 3 years on a contract in Kuwait

#### Pat in Kuwait

- After vaccination in March, Pat arrived in Ahmadi, Kuwait on 28<sup>th</sup>
   April 1947 ready to start work the next day as an Engineer with the Kuwait Oil Company for three years, subject to 3 months notice.
- The salary was £600 per annum with free accommodation and messing, and additional £96 per annum while in Kuwait.
- "in the initial period the accommodation will be necessarily somewhat austere."
- Contract ended 29<sup>th</sup> April 1950 but repatriated on or about 1<sup>st</sup> March.









Buried at the Vale Cemetery, Luton


